IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING
LITTERING ALONG ROADS IN PIKE COUNTY

WHEREAS, this Board has noticed excessive littering along roads in Pike County including the dumping of garbage, limbs, old mattresses and furniture, and other sorts of refuse, and that the same appears to create eyesores along the roads of the County,

NOW, THEREFORE, upon motion duly made and seconded, the following ordinance was proposed for adoption:

"ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LITTERING
ALONG ROADS IN PIKE COUNTY

It shall be unlawful for any person to litter along roads in Pike County, to include but not be limited to the dumping or abandoning of garbage, limbs and brush, old mattresses, old furniture, and refuse of every sort.

The penalty for violation of this ordinance shall be a \$100.00 mandatory fine upon conviction and the person or persons so convicted shall be made to pick up all litter, garbage, etc. from both sides of the road a distance of one (1) mile on each side of the place of offense.

If a Constable investigates and makes charges of littering under this ordinance, then upon conviction, and upon collection of the fine, \$50.00 of the \$100.00 fine shall be remitted to the Constable as special fees or reward for the prosecution and conviction.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after passage.

SO ADOPTED, this, the 9th day of January, A.D., 1987.


