IN THE MATTER OF AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING DISCHARGING FIREARMS
WITHIN ONE HUNDRED YARDS OF A SEWAGE LAGOON ON COUNTY OWNED PROPERTY

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried by the affirmative vote of all five supervisors, the Board of Supervisors adopted the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN ONE HUNDRED
YARDS OF A SEWAGE LAGOON ON COUNTY OWNED PROPERTY

WHEREAS, sewage lagoons contain certain equipment which may be damaged by gun fire, and

WHEREAS, an ordinance should be adopted prohibiting discharge of firearms within one hundred yards of a sewage lagoon on county owned property in order to protect certain equipment contained in said sewage lagoons,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Pike County, Mississippi, as follows:

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful to discharge a firearm within one hundred yards of a sewage lagoon on county owned property;

SECTION 2: Violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor and violators shall be punished, accordingly;

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall become effective immediately following publication.

PASSED AND ADOPTED, first as to sections, then as a whole, at the April 24, 1989 regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Pike County, Mississippi by the following vote:





be adopted:

"ORDINANCE PROHIBITING HUNTING ONE
AND FIFTY YARDS EITHER SIDE OF THE JAIL
JAIL BUILDING TO RAILROAD
ROAD ON THE COUNTY FARM

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt in that
area of one hundred and fifty yards on either side of
that certain road which runs from the Jail Building
northwesterly to the railroad tracks on the County
Farm property.

The penalty for violation of this ordinance shall be
that of a misdemeanor.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days
after passage.
